Last month, we looked at the wonder of the mycorrhizal network built into the underground and invisible root system of trees. I was reading Isaiah the other morning, and a passage in chapter 44 conked me on the head like an apple falling from its branch.

In what seems to be a slightly sarcastic comment, God lays out a scenario and asks us to consider what might be misguided. If you allow me, I will paraphrase it for you. And shall I make the rest of it an abomination?

Shall I fall down before a block of wood?" ²⁰He feeds on ashes; a deluded heart has led him astray, and he cannot deliver himself or say, "Is there not a lie in my right hand?"



hat are you going to be when you grow up?" Tim Troyer's father asked him this question when Tim was barely four years old.
Without hesitation, Tim answered, "I'm gonna be a blacksmith."
Tim's dad did not expect a young boy living in the Philippines to know anything about blacksmithing, but curious to discover Tim's thoughts, he asked, "What does a blacksmith do?"

Tim's answer: "Well, he puts something metal in a fire and makes it hot. Then he hits it with a hammer and makes something."

Last month, we discovered that Tim was raised in a missionary family and founded The Reckoning International and Forest of Hope. He serves with many others to help people make a life and a living. Tim is always open to opportunities to share God's love. He even pastored in the Sugarcreek, Ohio, area for nineteen years. Still, the desire to be a blacksmith, which God placed in Tim's little-boy heart, never went away. Like his mother, he enjoys making things with his hands. So, one day, grown-up Tim decided to make a knife.

"I never intended to be a knifemaker. I just wanted to make one knife for myself." Then, Tim needed to make another knife to correct the flaws in his first one. "Number two was better, but I wanted to try again for a good result." While making the third knife, Tim began

receiving requests from other people to make knives for them. Tim said, "Sure! That's how I became a knifemaker. And, lo and behold, I ended up being a blacksmith!"

WHAT IS IN YOUR HAND?

Tim thought it odd for a pastor to make knives, but remembers, "After I started, and got better at it, I became really fascinated with it!" One day, Tim was driving alone in his car and thinking about how much he loved his weird hobby. Then he spoke out loud, "Lord, I want you to know, if there's anything I can do with knifemaking to bless your heart or further your purposes, I put it on the altar. Take it." Immediately, Tim felt silly for saying such a thing to the Creator of the Universe. After all, Tim was just an amateur knifemaker. "Then," says Tim, "I didn't hear a voice, but I received a clear message to my heart, saying, That's precious to me. You're offering me your heart and your passion. Never discount that."

Then, Tim recalled the biblical account of Moses in Exodus 4. "God came to Moses, and Moses felt incapable, like he was not valuable enough to play a part in God's purposes." He had many excuses for God. Moses was insecure about his speaking abilities. He thought Pharaoh would not believe him. Moses felt sure Pharaoh would not believe the message was from God.

"And the LORD said unto [Moses], What is that in thine hand? And he said, A rod" (Exodus 4:2).

Tim says, "God used what was in Moses' hand to accomplish miraculous deeds and free his people from slavery. The stick in Moses' hand was the same stick used to separate the Red Sea and allow a victorious exodus for the Hebrew people." Tim realized God could use what was in his hand, too, and remained open to the possibilities.

Now, Tim has been making knives for over twenty years and teaches others how to use their hands to create knives. Jesse Miller, Stelyn Raber, and Jordan Chumney work with Tim at Sugarcreek Forge. Together, they create custom products, collaborate on projects, and teach others how to become knifemakers and great leaders. They offer opportunities and change lives.



A FEW STEPS IN THE PROCESS OF CRAFTING A KNIFE

ANOTHER MOSES

In 2014, a possibility became a reality when Tim met a modern-day Moses with the last name Tenywa. Although Tim was reluctant to use the time and energy, a persistent voice helped him see God's plan. That voice was Melissa Herman.

Melissa has an agricultural degree from Ohio State University and serves as a full-time soil scientist with The Reckoning International. Since 2013, Melissa has been helping people overcome poverty through opportunity by working with farmers in Uganda and Kenya. Tim says, "She does a lot to advance our agribased projects."

One day, Tim was weary and ready to leave Uganda after a Forest of Hope visit. He had pushed through jet lag, packed tons of effort into several twelve-hour workdays, and was facing a two-day trip through three airports to get home. Suddenly, *ding*, a text message came through from Melissa.

"Hey, on your way to the airport, I want you to stop and meet this professor. He's a great guy I met at Ohio State."

"I don't want to meet anybody right now. I'm tired and icky. I don't think I can even be nice."

"You're going to meet him, you're going to be Christlike, and you're going to be nice. You can stop and have a cup of coffee with him, and then you can go home."

"Okay!"

Soon, Tim was shaking the hand of Dr. Moses Tenywa, head of the agriculture department for Uganda's largest university. Dr. Tenywa was a Ugandan native who had gone to Ohio State on a scholarship and returned to his country with a doctorate in agriculture.

While conversing about cows and the professor's opportunities at Ohio State, Tim also learned Dr. Tenywa had founded a small church in his village and was deeply concerned about the fatherless young men unable to find jobs. Tim reports the unemployment rate in Uganda, for people age thirty and under, is a whopping 63 percent.

Dr. Tenywa gave the young men small jobs such as yard work to do around the church, but they needed real employment. Dr. Tenywa told Tim, "We don't really make anything in Uganda anymore, but hundreds of years ago we were known as blacksmiths. We want to make knives, but I don't know anything about making knives. Last week, I prayed, 'Lord, help me find someone who knows how to make knives.'"

Tim was stunned. "I about fell on the floor! It was a really cool, divine appointment. I thought, *Look at what* "WE DON'T

God is doing!" And sometimes, God speaks through a persistent woman named Melissa.

Tim explained to Dr. Tenywa that he was a knife maker and knew what the young men needed. Tim said, "I'll come and teach them."

THE FORGE

Once Tim was back in Ohio, he sent funds and emailed plans for a forge to Dr. Tenywa. Tim told the professor to begin gathering charcoal, a truck's brake drum, and several other items on a list.

On his next trip to Uganda, Tim brought board members from Forest of Hope to visit Dr. Tenywa so that more preparation and planning could take place. A couple of months later, Tim says, "I returned with some friends who could help me with the teaching."

The forge is set up in the village of Bamba, located just north of Uganda's capital, Kampala. Since there is no source for high-carbon steel in Uganda, the knives are made from recycled car parts. "We forge them out of Land Rover leaf springs and coil springs."

According to the Jake Hoback Knives website, "The forge was started in a wooden shack with a tin roof, an anvil, hand tools, and some fired-up young men. Over the last few years, they have worked really hard to hone their skills and move toward being sustainable as a business." The forge team outgrew a second workshop and currently operates in a permanent brick open-air building four times larger than their last one. Bamba Forge's new home includes a secure office, a training room, and a dining room for the guys. In addition to the forge area, a portion of the new building houses a sawmill.

With Bamba Forge now a 501 (c) (3) organization, Tim works with Ugandan leaders to provide livelihoods. "We want our relationship with the people of Uganda to help advance their communities and create opportunities for people who would not have hope otherwise." Even the employees at the hotel where Tim and his friends stay while in Uganda are more hopeful. When Tim shows them the knives created by the team at Bamba Forge, they proudly inquire, "These were made in Uganda?"

THE GUYS

The Bamba Forge team members are gaining knowledge and skill. "But," says Tim, "for me, it's more about the people. When we met Sam, he basically had his pants, shirt, and flip-flops." He slept on a bench and had not worked for several years. Tim told Sam, "God loves you. It's not God's will that you feel adrift and have nothing to do. God has a plan. We want to teach you how to make knives."

It must have been God's plan, indeed. According to Tim, "Sam took to knife-making as a duck takes to water!" In a short time, Sam moved through the many levels of skill required to be a talented knifemaker. Learn and practice. Learn and practice. Learn and practice. Learn and practice. The artistic qualities seemed to come naturally to Sam. Tim says, "It's like the difference between being a cabinet maker and a woodcarver." Seeing Sam go from just having clothes on his back to having a small place to live, some animals, and working at the forge confirmed the purpose Tim and his partners held for Bamba Forge. "Sam became really good at it! He is now married and has a child. He's a skilled man."

Ivan is not just another guy at the forge. He has a history not one of us would care to claim. Ivan has no idea who his father is. His mother abandoned Ivan when he was only six weeks old, leaving him at her father's house, never to return. Thankfully, his blind grandfather raised Ivan to the best of his ability, and Dr. Tenywa helped Ivan find his way to Bamba Forge.

One day, while Tim's knifemaking buddy from Chattanooga, Tennessee, demonstrated knifemaking to Ivan, the young man's tears dropped onto the blade. Ivan said, "This is the first time anyone has taught me to do anything."

Ivan's mentor revealed that his mom also had given him away at birth. The sting of rejection had pierced

both of their hearts. After tears came the hugs.

Ivan cried, "I don't know what to do. I feel like a big kid. I don't have anyone to show me how to have a family and be responsible." But now, Ivan is becoming a man with the help of new father figures and his brothers at Bamba Forge.

Martin's story also holds tragedy. As a young boy, Martin was diagnosed with sickle cell anemia. Martin's dad determined to provide medical treatment for his son and made the mistake of borrowing money from loan sharks. When Martin's dad couldn't pay back the money, the loan sharks came around. Tim says, "They came and beat up Martin's dad and Martin." His dad did not survive the beating, so little Martin grew up homeless, eating out of the trash heaps.

Professor Tenywa invited Martin to the Bamba Forge family. Tim says, "Martin was only seventeen or



eighteen when we met him. He was quiet, didn't smile, and had only three years of education. Having adult males around who loved him, little by little brought Martin out of his shell."

The guys taught him, teased him, and put him into fun-loving headlocks. They made him one of them. In response, Martin gained his true value. Martin said, "I never could say I'm anything. I just felt like a nothing. Now, I'm a knifemaker."

Along with the anemia, Martin had asthma. Tragically, a couple of years ago, Martin died from an asthma attack. Tim and the guys of Bamba Forge paid for Martin's funeral and went to his home village to pay their respects. Tim says, "Knowing Martin and watching him grow had a big impact on all of us. Our product isn't about knives. It's about transforming lives."

One of the young men who worked at the forge is the oldest of seven children. When his parents died, he became the father of six siblings at the age of sixteen, working any jobs he could find. Although this young man dreamed of attending college, he sacrificed his dream to care for his family. He even helped one of his siblings gain a scholarship to attend college.

CHARACTER TRAINING

Bamba Forge is a place where boys become men. "We do a lot of work to train and develop good, plain values in our people." It's about relationships. By partnering with others to teach values, we give value to life. "The forge guys meet weekly to study values from the book of Proverbs." They learn forty different principles, all coming directly from God's true Word. The lessons prove to develop character in the young men who lack such training from a father. The following are a few examples of the Proverbs learned and the values they teach.

Attitude: "A merry heart doeth good like a medicine: but a broken spirit drieth the bones" (Proverbs 17:22).

Proper Thinking: "For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he" (Proverbs 23:7).

Restraint: "He that keepeth his mouth keepeth his life: but he that openeth wide his lips shall have destruction" (Proverbs 13:3).

Productivity: "Where no oxen are, the crib is clean: but much increase is by the strength of the ox" (Proverbs 14:4).

Generosity: "He that giveth unto the poor shall not lack: but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse" (Proverbs 28:27).

Criticism: "He that refuseth instruction despiseth his own soul: but he that heareth reproof getteth understanding" (Proverbs 15:32).

In addition to the young men developing individual character as they practice these values, there is also a more vibrant work environment, a brotherhood. "At Bamba Forge, the value is experienced, not just spoken over them," says Tim. "They love it!"

The goal for Bamba Forge is to become self-supporting. Tim says, "We're not there yet, but we're making good progress toward that end. One way to improve business sustainability is to diversify." In addition to making knives, Bamba Forge has launched a welding operation and added a sawmill in their new workshop. "We bought a sawmill and had it shipped to the forge in Bamba." The forge guys will cut boards from the trees of Forest of Hope, supporting both ministries.

Tim says, "Widows plant trees to help orphans go to school and orphans cut the trees into lumber to make them more valuable. We can sell the boards for more than we can sell the tree. That's a value add."

Tim shared that on their last trip to Uganda, "We were able to meet a guy who owns a tannery. We bought leather to make sheaths for knives. I bring home these knives to sell here." Bamba Forge will soon have a sales opportunity through www.knivesshipfree.com. "We have a large company that wants to buy our knives and sell them for us. It's just on the horizon."

CHANGING A LIFE

"It only takes a little to change a life." Tim Troyer has witnessed this reality over and over again. Maybe it's the reason he remains passionate about heeding God's direction and using what is in his hand. He understands the dignity of loving another human being and connecting them to the Lord. It's plain and simple. Generosity is shared.

God generously shares His provision with His people. God places what He purposes into our hands, and then asks us to use it for good. It's true. When we love God, He gives us the purpose, provision, and ability to love others.

And Now For Something Completely Different...

INSTANTLY FREEZE WATER

What if someone told you that you can turn a bottle of liquid water into ice in a matter of seconds? Would you believe them? With the summer heat now fully upon us, we hope you enjoy this summertime trick as much as we did.

- Take a bottle of **Purified** Drinking Water and let it sit on the counter for four hours, or until it's room temperature.
- Place the bottle in the freezer for 1.5 2 hours.
- Remove the bottle very carefully so you don't agitate the water too much and place it onto the counter. When you're ready, lift the bottle and smack it on the counter with a decent amount of force. Watch as the whole bottle of water turns into ice instantly!

Please note that the water must be purified. There are a lot of factors that play into this trick working correctly; if your first attempt doesn't work, don't give up! Try again—perhaps try leaving the bottle in the freezer for a bit longer.



WHY DOES THIS HAPPEN?

Using purified water is the key to this trick. When water freezes, ice crystals start their formation around particles in the water. Purified water is free of all these impurities; therefore, ice crystals have nothing to start forming around. This allows the liquid water to reach temperatures below 32°F (the normal freezing point of water) without freezing. When you smack the bottle on the counter, you create little bubbles in the water that allow ice crystals to form around. Since the water is super-chilled, once ice begins to form it spreads incredibly quickly throughout the bottle until all the liquid turns to ice.

Dear Readers,


I don't think people realize that when God ordained marriage and declared in Genesis 2:24 that "the two will become one," He meant it. A husband and wife growing together over the years really do become "one." But what happens when one-half of a marriage dies? It hurts! I often hear the widow or widower say, "I felt like I was cut in half."

I felt that way too. Didn't you? I pictured in my mind that there'd been a terrible accident, and half of me was lying on an ambulance gurney. The other half was gone. I was in shock, helpless, and bleeding to death. "Oh God, how could You do this to me?" I cried.

But today, as I look back, I can honestly say with the writer of the hymn, "Amazing Grace "...I once was lost, but now am found..." Let me assure you: the pain of loss doesn't have to last forever.







I don't write for widows because I'm still grieving; I write as a sacred privilege God has given me to serve you. To tell you that God loves you. He intends to help you push up from these ashes. He intends for your life to grow and bloom in a unique and wonderful way.

As God gently nudges you along this path, I think you'll learn what I've learned about survival and happiness: it's all about choices.

As I lay on that figurative gurney, feeling cut in half, I had to work through a difficult decision about my widowhood—it could either be a gurney where I was a trauma victim, or it could be an altar of sacrifice and worship. Romans 12:1 says, "... offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship."

There was no changing the fact that I was a widow, but as a new widow, I could choose to be a

helpless victim, or I could choose to worship God by living "holy and pleasing to God," as the Scripture said. Trusting God's way, not my way. Choosing to set aside my complaints, arguments, and grumbles about widowhood didn't come naturally. Sometimes the choice really was a sacrifice.

It was hard to allow God to have His way! But over and over again, that's what it boiled down to. I would have preferred my own death instead of my husband's, but God was asking me to live; to live without my husband, and to live for God. I finally made the choice to say, "Okay." That was the best I could muster, just "Okay." Not a single "Hip hip hooray!" But that's all God asks of us—simple surrender.

Have you made that choice yet? For many Christians, it's a huge struggle and a secret wrestling match with God. Sooner or later, in my opinion, there


comes a day when life gets a little easier because God's made you a little stronger. You grow, you become whole, and a new chapter of life begins. It's pretty amazing!

- I'm thankful I'm not a victim on a hospital gurney. Instead, my life is on a holy altar, and I am free to live, worship, and please God. I don't have to grieve forever. I can breathe again. And love and laugh and sing.
- God is in control. He never fails or makes mistakes. I'm so thankful for the relief of knowing my husband's death was not a surprise or mistake to God.



• When there were times I wanted to die, I didn't, because God knew He'd make me whole.

I pray that you, too, will discover it's all about choices. Yes, God loves you. Yes, God knows your very thoughts. Yes, God is in control of your circumstances. Yes, He is with you... There's so much to be thankful for. Surrender and trust with a simple "Okay." //


From an acorn-size egg hatches a mysterious creature with a duck-like bill, beaver-like tail, and reptile-like stance. It's a bird! It's a reptile! It's a—platypus!

Around four months of age, the young platypus ventures out of its dark burrow, which is sometimes as long as 65 feet, into the Australian fresh air. The furry platypus is an adept hunter. Its front webbed feet expertly paddle through the cold waters, while the hind feet and tail steer. The flat tail also helps it dive deep.

Since flaps cover its eyes, ears, and nose, how can the platypus find food? Its bill is equipped with sensitive electroreceptors, pinpointing prey like shrimp and crayfish as the platypus digs through mud and pebbles. With its catch stored in cheek pouches, the platypus comes up to the surface to grind the food between its toothless jaws.

DIVINE DESIGN

The Europeans who first encountered the platypus late in the 18th century were puzzled about how to classify an animal with mammal, reptile, and bird features. Some even disregarded the



patchwork platypus as a hoax. Early studies labeled the platypus as primitive until discovery of the intricate design of electroreception, which enables the platypus to sense electrical currents from the muscle contractions of the animals it hunts.

If the platypus evolved, we would expect to find transitional forms in the fossil record. Yet platypus fossils, which have been found as far as South America, vary little from their modern counterparts. The only difference is that today's platypus has degenerated from the early, more robust platypus. Recent evidence shows that platypuses lived at the same time as dinosaurs, a finding that fits perfectly with the creation account.

The platypus is Ken Ham's favorite animal:

Every time an evolutionist looks at the platypus, I think God smiles! Think about it. It has a bill like a duck, a beaver-like tail, webbed feet like an otter, hair like a bear, claws like a reptile, lays eggs like a turtle, and has poison like a snake!1

- The platypus is generally nocturnal and is a hardworking animal, spending about 12 hours each day searching for food. Dives for food can take about a minute before the platypus comes up for air.

After learning about the platypus, perhaps your evolutionist friend will acknowledge the Creator's design. But don't stop there! The God who reveals himself in creation also reveals himself in his Word the Bible. Take your friend on a tour through Romans. Here are a few highlights to share: Romans 1:18-32, 3:19-28, 6:23, 10:9-10. Pray that God's kindness would lead many to turn to Jesus as the only Savior from sin. //

Affordable Healthcare Partners

Affordable Healthcare Partners (AHP) has a mission to improve and protect the health and quality of life of the individuals and communities it serves. It does so by providing quality, affordable, and convenient primary care. Founded by nurse practitioner Krista Michener, AHP is a self-pay clinic for adults and teenagers ages thirteen and up.

A self-pay clinic does not accept insurance because patient health is the bottom line instead of insurance prices. While working in Canton at a family practice, Michener kept seeing two hardships for people that didn't have access to insurance. The first was that many would put off any medical care until something catastrophic happened because they couldn't afford it. The second was that self-pay patients never knew what their visit would cost and were often paying more than they should have.

"It shouldn't take something tragic for people to access healthcare," Michener explains. "When healthcare practices have contracts with insurance companies, there are contracted rates. Practices don't have flexibility in what they charge people who don't have insurance because doctors have to charge at least a certain percent of the insurance's contracted rate. This isn't fair to people who don't have insurance. They are paying more because their care provider does business with insurance companies, so they're still essentially doing business with an insurance company."

Every morning, Michener prays in her closet, and that was where God prompted her to start a self-pay clinic in her hometown. She began thinking about Wooster and all the people working in hard-labor manufacturing jobs who may not have access to insurance or have very high deductibles. Many Amish and Mennonite clients who pay cash are caught up in a confusing medical system that doesn't meet their specific needs.

"We should be able to set up an appointment with a local care provider and know exactly what it will cost," Michener says.

Now Michener has a practice that offers structured pay so patients never have to guess what they'll pay. A routine visit will cost \$80. Telehealth is \$60. House calls are available for those who are homebound due to age or disabilities and start at \$120 plus mileage inside Wayne County and \$150 plus mileage outside Wayne County. Mileage is calculated at \$1.50 per mile round trip from AHP's location at 2056 Portage Road in Wooster.

Office visits can include regular sick care, routine physicals, pap smears, and more. Michener also wants to help people find the best prices on prescriptions. She has a lot of experience with the elderly, people with disabilities, and those with mental health issues.

"My main passion is taking care of mental health in primary care and treating the whole person," Michener says. "I may be starting small, but I think a lot is lost with high-tech healthcare. Providers have gotten away from taking good patient histories and performing physicals because they are relying so much on technology. They aren't listening to people. Testing is so important, but most of my best work as a nurse practitioner has come from listening to my patients."

At AHP, mental health is just as important as physical health. An individual's health affects not only themselves but also their family and everything they do. Michener and her team want to educate others that the body and the mind can't be separated and help them get rid of the shame associated with getting help for mental well-being. When someone feels fear, the whole body reacts.

"We take care of the body to calm the mind, but by taking care of the mind, we can help heal the body," Michener explains. "Some may think their affliction is a matter of faith, but God loves us and wants us to use the resources that are here to help so we can live fuller, happier lives and take care of our families."

The team at the clinic also has a special heart for those with special needs.

"My heart for that comes from many different places." Michener has five children of her own and is in the process of adopting a boy in need of special care. "We are all children of God, and everyone deserves to be treated with dignity and taken care of. I have seen personally from my job in Canton how living in poverty can impact those with special needs, especially if they don't have family."

So the most critical things for someone with special needs are having someone who loves them, having a healthcare environment where they feel safe and comfortable, and having the healthcare provider take sufficient time with them and their family.

"Everybody's quality of life matters, and other practices are set up to take care of able-bodied people," Michener says. "We need to help the people who can't help themselves."

All these thoughts put together helped create the Affordable Healthcare Partners.

"It took a lot of prayer and an act of God to remove all the things that kept happening that would have stopped this business from coming to pass," Michener shared. "The number of times I prayed, 'This was Your idea! You have to make this work!' There were so many times it almost didn't happen."

But with grace and perseverance, the clinic opened on February 28, 2020, and is now open to new patients. Michener asks her community to reach out and tell her what they need and what she can do to provide the best care she can!

"I am trying to reach people that aren't getting healthcare right now because it isn't easily accessible. My job is to convince people they are worth getting taken care of and to trust me that I can help them with their primary care needs," she finishes. "It's why I do what I do. I want people's lives to be better."



Mt. Hope Dental

hen my husband, Philip, and I moved to Ohio after six years as mission optometrist and dentist in my native country of Haiti, we lived in Mt. Hope for the first year. We rented a house from Paul Yoder right on State Route 241 at the entrance to Wayne Dalton. Paul would half-jokingly say that Mt. At the time, our four children were very young (ages two to eight), and opening my own dental office was only a dream.

- Our four-year-old son hopping in Paul's buggy and asking him which of the buttons/switches made the buggy go...
 I guess he thought the horse was just an ornament.

Opening a practice in Kidron

Fast forward six years, and the children were all attending Central Christian School in Kidron. Phil had started an optometry practice in Kidron. It made sense that when the time came for me to start my own office in 2007, we would join our resources by working out of the same building right across from the children's school.

Back to Mt. Hope

Since living in Mt. Hope, that little bug planted in my ear by Paul Yoder about a clinic in Mt. Hope never went away. As time went by, I needed a succession plan for my patients. Small towns are a wonderful place to practice, but the tendency is for new dentists to stay in the big city. I want to see the dental service we provide in Kidron continue beyond my time, so I figured that one day I would need to have two dentists replace me. With two offices and the fact that Raber Dental has also served the Holmes County Training Center since 2007, we could even accommodate three dentists.

Two years ago, I started inquiries about potential locations that could be converted/built into a dental office. Then Paul Yoder came through again and alerted me that Al and Edna Yoder were putting their place up for sale! I hated to see the beautiful yard and the old barn vanish, but we needed a parking lot.

Today, we are excited to open an office in my original Ohio community, where people are so friendly and supportive. Of course, Mt. Hope has grown and changed, and it is almost the big city. This is why we have added a covered bicycle/E-bicycle parking station in addition to buggy and car parking.

Dr. Tae Hwang joins the practice



During our second child's junior year in high school, a Korean exchange student named Tae Hwang started attending Central Christian School. I got to know Tae through my daughter and the school. At one point I was asked, along with others, to participate in a "Careers in Health Care" symposium at the school. Tae approached me and said he wanted to become a dentist. I mentored him along the way, and today I am so proud of him and his achievements! Having been a foreign student myself, I know that a very high bar is set for foreign students to be admitted to dental or medical school.

"Dr. Tae" graduated from Central Christian School, class of 2012; Goshen College, Class of 2016; and University of Michigan School of Dentistry, Class of 2020. Dr. Tae has moved to Mt. Hope to live for at least the first year out of dental school. Both Dr. Tae and I will work at both offices. The plan for the first year is for the Mt. Hope office to be open Tuesday through Friday and the Kidron office to be open Monday through Thursday.





How we are addressing COVID-19

It is a bit daunting to be opening an office in a time of uncertainty. However, Dr. Tae and I both believe that God is in charge and has a plan no matter what is going on in the world.

At both Mt. Hope Dental and Raber Dental, we always like to go the extra mile. After much research, we took additional steps to protect everyone from both infections and unnecessary chemicals. We installed ultraviolet light disinfection units inside our heating and air-conditioning ducts. We have Novaerus non-chemical ultra-low-energy plasma technology filters-imported from Ireland-in our waiting room and treatment room areas. We also use the Eco One technology to make electrolyzed water (using only water and salt) to sanitize the entire office, including the waiting room and bathrooms.

Dentistry is no stranger to infectious illness. Outside of a hospital or outpa-

tient surgical room, dentists are leaders in infection control. We make protecting our clients and our workers a top priority. The primary reason governor DeWine immediately shut down dental offices for all but urgent care was to reassign our masks to front line health care delivery during the crisis. In outpatient health care settings, dentists were the biggest consumers of masks.

Dentists were already doing everything that was needed to prevent infection inside their office. With this pandemic, we have added some extras as required of ALL businesses by Ohio law.

There is something absolutely beautiful about the church coming together to worship God on a regular basis. I say "regular" because most churches that I am familiar with meet weekly, but I have visited many churches overseas that meet on a daily basis. I am even aware of churches that meet every other week. I am not sure that the actual amount of time between meetings is nearly as important as the fact that it is an agreed upon, clearly communicated, and regular coming together of the body of Christ.

The Holy Spirit-inspired writer of Hebrews seemed to think that this meeting together was important.

Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, **not neglecting to meet together**, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. (Hebrews 10:24–25, emphasis added)

The meeting together is important! We should by no means neglect it. However, I have said it before and I will say it again: You don't have to be at church to worship God.

This truth is so important for us as worshipers. I am big on corporate worship. I cannot stress enough how important corporate worship is for us (or to God, for that matter), but corporate worship is at its absolute best when private worship is also a regular reality. In the case of private worship, I would use the word "regular" to mean "daily."

When I traveled overseas as a missionary, I had the experience of being in a nation, predominantly of a different religion, during their holy month. The adherents of this particular belief celebrate their holy month by starving themselves throughout the day and breaking their fast each night when the sun goes down. One of my friends who practiced this religion invited me to participate in the breaking of the fast one night, so I went. I wasn't very hungry, because I had been eating throughout the day, but I thought it would be a neat experience. What I witnessed was, quite frankly, disturbing.

A dozen or more people were gathered around a banquet table, staring at the feast before them with bulging eyes, twitchy hands, and rumbling bellies. As soon as the sun went down and the call to break the fast rang out through the city, fingers began flailing, and food went flying everywhere! I kept my own hands back (mostly out of fear that they would be mistaken for food in the midst of the madness), but my friends devoured every last bit of food on the table. Even if I had wanted to participate, I would have had to jockey for position. A few minutes later, with sauces and shreds of chicken stuck to their hands and mouths, my friends sat down and reclined deeply into their chairs, completely stuffed.

Is this a picture of our corporate worship settings? Do we come so starved for the things of God, so desperate to dig in for ourselves that we become oblivious of those around us? Or are we so filled by other things (like I was) that we don't really even participate at all? Perhaps we just stand back and watch with intrigue and curiosity.

There is a better way. Jesus reminded his disciples to pray for their "daily bread." As worshipers, we should be praying for our "daily bread" and regularly meeting with God on our own. We don't have to "fast" from God and then try to stuff ourselves during corporate worship. God is with us and is available to us all of the time—every single moment of every single day. Let us regularly taste and see that the Lord is good!

Still, when we come together, we should come hungry for God to show up in ways that only happen during corporate worship. Let's not allow ourselves to be so full of other things that we are indifferent towards God. Come hungry... but not starved.







TURNED STEEPLY UPWARD





The walk begins easily, through a grassy meadow on a picturesque farm east of Zurich, Switzerland, in the foothills of the Alps. Follow the path for a short distance, and the way becomes increasingly rugged and the climb turns steeply upward as it enters a forest. The destination is a cave named Täuferhöhle, or "baptism cave," a large, spacious cave located near Zurich. Switzerland. with natural waterfalls covering the mouth of the cave. Each year visitors make their way in a sort of pilgrimage to follow the footsteps of those who, in an attempt to escape persecution, worshiped in secret at this site 500 years earlier.1

It takes little imagination for the mind's eye to picture people like Margret, who we met last month, easing their way through the predawn darkness towards the cave. It was a perfect hiding place. From the opening, the forest can be seen beyond the waterfalls. Human voices melded with the sound of the rushing water. All the finest cathedrals in Europe with their stained glass windows could not compete with this cathedral of earth and water and light.

The scene of meeting secretly for worship in caves and forests and behind closed doors was increasingly played out across Europe by those who practiced adult baptism. Anabaptists, or those who practiced adult baptism, believed the church should consist only of adult men and women who voluntarily chose to follow Christ and were committed to holy living. Therefore, the baptism of infants "was not the cause of their disavowal of the state church; it was only the symbol of the cause."2 Adult baptism was the symbol by which an adult expressed their belief in Christ and entered into the church. It was an early belief in the separation of church and state and ripped apart a social fabric in place for 1,200 years. In the minds of the magistrates, this endangered both the church and the state. For this, Anabaptists were hated and persecuted by Catholics and Protestants alike and were forced to flee and worship in secret.

The percentages of women who were arrested for Anabaptism is higher than among other groups persecuted for religious beliefs and tell us that women were more central to the Anabaptist movement.³ Thirty percent of Anabaptist martyrs in the *Martyrs Mirror* were women, but in some regions, court records show women were nearly half of those arrested as Anabaptists.⁴ In the Tirol region of Austria from 1525–1531, forty-six percent of Anabaptists arrested were women.⁵ Since Anabaptists attempted to conceal their activities from authorities, we know only some of the women. They often come to us through lists of names in court records, and these were women for whom something went wrong.

The high number of women involved in Anabaptist activities connects to a view of the "priesthood of all believers." Rebaptism carried with it the idea that those baptized were all "priests" with equal ability to hear the Spirit of God. Therefore, all believers could interpret the scriptures and receive direct revelation rather than

going through a priest. Since, in Christ, all believers are "priests," Anabaptist women were more nearly "companions in the faith, mates in missionary enterprise, and mutual exhorters in readiness for martyrdom," than among other reforming Protestants.⁶ This belief in a "Priesthood of all believers," characterized their actions and their worship services.

The sense of equality that arose from this teaching broke down the boundaries between the social classes of rich and poor that were firmly in place in their world. Two deacons and their deaconess wives, Katherina Wiedenmann and the wife of Laux Kreler, are clear examples of how Anabaptists broke through the strict boundaries between rich and poor and labored together as deacons in the Anabaptist group of Augsburg, Germany.

Katherina Wiedenmann was the wife of Simprecht, a poor cobbler in Augsburg listed as a "purse-keeper" for the congregation. The activities reveal they were deacons, and Katharina's name comes up most often as the one handing out food and goods to those in need. She distributed food to needy Anabaptists, housed

fleeing refugees, harbored leaders in hiding, and held secret meetings. In at least one instance, she helped to pass along a pastoral letter sent to "the women of Augsburg by Galthas Berchtold." With all the activity, their cobbler shop provided excellent cover for people coming and going without causing suspicion.

By comparison is the unnamed wife of Laux Kreler, a wealthy and connected goldsmith in the city. The Krelers labored along with the Wiedenmanns as deacons in the Augsburg congregation. It is clear they were tapping other sources and providing their own monies, which were then distributed among needy Anabaptists who were fleeing. They illegally housed leaders in hiding such as Leupold and Dorfbrunner, along with Anna, the wife of imprisoned leader Sigmund following his arrest in 1527.8

While the Krelers and Wiedenmanns labored on an equal level in the church, Simprecht complained that the poor Anabaptists such as themselves were called to court and tortured while the magistrates ignored the wealthy Anabaptists. When arrested, Simprecht was beaten out of town with rods and Katharina was led out of town in

exile, unable to return to their home. The connections of the wealthy Krelers gave them warning so they could flee unharmed to the city of Strasbourg. Nonetheless, both the Krelers and Wiedenmanns labored together in the church and fled their homes for the sake of their faith.⁹

If both poor and wealthy women were involved in Anabaptism, so were women in all stages of life. Especially poignant are the accounts of pregnant women. Two such women were Anna Gasser of the Tirol region and Susanna Doucher of Augsburg.

When the Peasant War broke out in the Tirol region in 1525, Anna's husband Hans was one of the leaders. By 1528, they became involved with the Anabaptists who traveled into the area, but their involvement in the Peasant War did not help them. By the end of the year they were arrested twice in connection with Anabaptism. At the second arrest, all those arrested were to be beaten at the pillory.

Pregnant women were often released until after the birth, then taken to trial. Since this was the second

arrest, Hans was sentenced to execution while Anna and her friend Mairin were to be beaten publicly, though both were pregnant. Contrary to normal procedures Anna was then held in prison, where she suffered a miscarriage. She was later released; however, she lost custody of her children. Here is a woman in the middle stages of her life, her husband executed, herself pregnant, publicly beaten, and most likely tortured while pregnant. She loses all of her children including the miscarriage in prison. Yet, she still held to her faith in Christ rather than recant. She fled alone, leaving her children behind, and most likely lived out the remainder of her life in Moravia.¹⁰

Susanna Doucher is another such woman who could have been found making her way through a forest to worship outside the city of Augsburg in February of 1528. She was the pregnant wife of a wealthy sculptor in the city. Baptized sometime in 1527 against her husband's wishes, she immediately began attending Anabaptist meetings while also housing and caring for a poor Anabaptist widow.

It was in the Doucher home that several hundred Anabaptists gathered on Easter Sunday, April 12, 1528, and here the police made a large raid, arresting the eighty-eighty who did not escape. For her involvement, Susanna was sentenced to be branded on both cheeks (a typical punishment), and banished from the city for life. Unlike many others, the council took pity on her, ostensibly since she was pregnant but more likely since her husband was a public figure and not an Anabaptist. They forewent the branding and permitted her to be led from the city in irons to humiliate her, but permitted her to return at a later time.¹¹

These women crossed social boundaries and age barriers. Maids shared with noblewomen, and the wife of the cobbler broke bread with the wife of the knight and wealthy goldsmith. This was not the result of a special economic or social teaching; rather, it was a result of Anabaptist theology that saw the kingdom of Christ as made up of those who personally chose to follow after Christ. In this kingdom, there was an equality that superseded the Protestant reforms of Luther and Zwingli or the temporal structures created by the earthly kingdom.

These women were both peasants and nobles, mothers and wives, and former nuns turned Anabaptist. They were elderly and youth, those whose husbands were part of the movement, and those whose husbands did not support them. They spread the Gospel, held meetings, carried messages, fed the hungry refugees, and harbored the fugitive outcasts fleeing from persecution. For this, they were arrested, chained in their houses, branded on their faces, cruelly tortured, and martyred. Many died for their faith, and through their persecution or death we hear their voices today. They were women making thoughtful choices for the care of their own souls, though it often cost them their families and lives. //

In my panic, I had aimed the nozzle the wrong direction and taken a face full of pepper spray.


"АНННННННННННННН!"

I also forgot that Rob was still on the phone, which I had set down. Rob was driving home, and when he heard my screams of pain, he assumed that the bear was in the process of shredding me to ribbons.

So Rob floored the accelerator and raced for home at 90 miles an hour—maybe faster.

Pepper spray also causes an immediate release of the contents of a person's nose, so snot was flowing like a fountain. (Sorry, but that's the only way I can think to describe it.) I used my hand to wipe my nose, and in the process I just spread the oil-based pepper spray all over my face. My eyes also swelled so badly that I could hardly open them with my fingers. A timely topic to discuss is fleas and flea prevention. In my experience, fleas have not been much of an issue in a typical "kennel" situation, because in these environments, there is no place for the flea eggs to live and the dog's exposure to fleas is minimal. As more people raise larger dogs and as the outdoor requirements for dogs are changing, more people have been putting dogs in outdoor runs on grass. Therefore, I am beginning to see more dogs and puppies with fleas.

Flea problems tend to be worse in the late summer and early fall, probably because the populations have been able to grow throughout the spring and summer. To prevent flea infestations from building up, it is very important that you closely monitor your dogs, and if a problem develops, treat it quickly.

First of all, to help you identify them, fleas are small, reddish-brownish insects that hop, not fly. If an animal has a lot of fleas, you can easily see fleas crawling around on the skin if you part their fur. I commonly find fleas around

the head and neck area and just above the tail head. If an animal has just a few fleas, it may be difficult to find the adult fleas just by parting the hair because they move pretty fast.

If you see black particles that look like pepper in the dog's hair coat, this can also be a sign that your dog may have fleas. If you put these black particles on a white paper towel and wet it, you will see the water on the paper towel turn reddish. These black particles are flea feces, and the red is from the digested blood the fleas have ingested.

Another easy and helpful way that you can check for fleas on your dogs is to use a flea comb. It is a very inexpensive, fine-tooth comb that will pull fleas and flea feces out of the hair coat and help you quickly determine if your animal has picked up fleas. Use the comb on your dogs as you bring them back into the kennel from the outside run. Not all animals are allergic to fleas, so just relying on them scratching is not an accurate way to diagnose if an animal has fleas.

In addition to causing some animals to itch, fleas ingest your dog's blood. If a severe infestation is present, some animals, especially puppies, become anemic (have low red blood cells). If an animal ingests fleas while grooming themselves, they can also develop a tapeworm infection where you will see small white worms, about the size of a grain of rice, pass in the dog's stool.

The flea life cycle consists of egg, larvae, pupa, and adult. This is important to understand, especially when we discuss treatment. You will need to remember that some treatments are only target adult fleas, but there are likely eggs, larvae, and pupae still in the environment that can become sources of infection for your dog. All



the life stages can survive for some length of time off of a host. The adult fleas can survive at the right conditions for around two months without a host animal. Also, one adult flea can lay up to fifty eggs daily, so you see how quickly flea populations can multiply.

Treatments for fleas will need to be done on a regular basis if a flea infection has developed, instead of just one treatment where you kill only the adult fleas.

The eggs, larvae, and pupa will continue to hatch and develop and grow into adult fleas, so don't think your treatment isn't working; you need to break the entire life cycle of the flea, and this will take some time, usually three months. It also helps if you treat the environment where the dogs spend most of their time because you can decrease the other stages of the flea life cycle and prevent them from hatching into adult fleas.

There are many treatments available for fleas on your animal and for their environment. They range in effectiveness, ease of use, price, and safety for you and your animal. Older flea control methods such as powders, dips, shampoos, and flea collars may still be effective and are inexpensive, but tend to be messy and only effective on adult fleas.

Older style flea collars tend to control fleas only around the neck of animals. However, there are some newer collars where the medication from the collar is absorbed into the body and is more effective against fleas. Collars may also become less effective if the dog gets wet frequently.

If you are using flea powder or shampoo, you may need to reapply powders frequently or bathe your animals daily to have effective control of fleas. Dips can be messy and toxic to dogs and also to the people dipping the dogs. Newer sprays and topical "spot on" applications are long-lasting, easy to use, and safe, but are also more expensive.

Remember to check if the product you are planning to use is safe for pregnant and nursing females. Don't forget to also treat the environment in which the dog lives. I recommend discussing your particular situation with your veterinarian and determining the best flea control program for your needs. //

Hey, what's the good word!

Attitude: the capacity to stay positive and optimistic despite the circumstances. I want to take a dive under the hood with this topic and see if any of you need a tune-up.

If we have a positive attitude, we think optimistically, hopefully, and cooperatively, and our behavior reflects this thinking. If we have a negative attitude, we are resentful, uncooperative, and cynical in our thinking and behavior. Which attitude do you typically possess?

Attitude is a value closely associated with success or the lack thereof. Typically, mediocre teams consist of players or employees that are negative, believe things are never their fault, or have bad attitudes. Great teams, however, have extremely positive people, and that's contagious. They choose positive thoughts and behaviors and are constantly optimistic in every circumstance.

Attitude requires a couple of things. First, our attitude is our choice. When we accept responsibility for our attitude, we can see every experience as an opportunity to learn and grow. It is not always easy to be hopeful and positive, but we get to choose.

Finally, there is contribution. Positive people are generous people. They see the good in others because they look for it. They encourage people who are down, compliment others, share affection, and give credit to others. The more we share positivity with others, the more we reinforce it in our own lives.

Certain things will hinder you from having a good attitude. Let's start with blame. Blaming others makes it

difficult to have a positive attitude and gives control of our situation to other people and circumstances. We blame our attitudes on fate, experiences, parents, relationships—even God. When we blame outside forces, we lose the power to impact our own lives, let alone the lives of others.

Another hindrance is fatigue. Exhaustion can strip hopeful people of their positive perspective. Without proper rest and rejuvenation, we will find it difficult to maintain a positive outlook. And I don't know about you, but I tend to be a little cranky when I'm hungry.

I've found two exercises to be very beneficial in my life. The first one is a gratitude journal. Every morning, write down three (or more) things for which you are grateful. This will have a great impact on you and your attitude. The second one is the "No Complaining' challenge. The goal is to not complain for twenty-four hours straight. Good luck; this one is tough for me, but my complaining goes down significantly when I do this.

It is essential to have the right attitude and approach to your life and work. When you see the good, look for the good, and expect the good, you find the good and the good finds you.

So, ask yourself where you are not seeing, looking for, or expecting the good in your life. One place you could start is simply by adjusting your own attitude.
