OUI Story

A tale of adoption, a magazine, forgotten children, and a family of readers that ties it all together.


LISA: Sometimes the Lord calls us with a gentle nudge. Other times His calling can feel like a rush of a sudden wind when things begin to whirl around us, seemingly out of nowhere. The calling to adopt a child grew in my heart from the time I was a young girl. When I was six years old, I first learned (to the best of my six-year-old capacity) that there were children in the world who did not have someone to care for him or her. I couldn't fathom that there were babies needing to be held and loved, and I wanted to rush to them! I used to dream of opening the front door to find a baby who needed love and imagined what it must be like to care for dozens of babies, to make sure they felt loved and valued.

The call to adopt steadily grew stronger as I grew older. The extra bedrooms in our home remained empty despite being readied with a crib, a toddler bed, diapers, baby gear, and tiny outfits

hanging washed and ready in the closet. After five years of marriage, Marlin and I both felt it was time for us to complete our adoption home study and take those first steps to make the dream of adoption a reality.

We didn't begin our journey to adopt children with special needs specifically, but as we completed our home study paperwork, we asked the Lord to bring us the children who needed us the most and to equip us to meet their needs. Having no idea what to expect, we completed our home study, and just a few weeks after it was approved, we were sent a photo of a little boy. I will never forget seeing his face for that first time: I knew this was our son. The next day found us driving nervously to our adoption agency to pick up our son. He was three years old, and we had little idea how much our lives had changed overnight.

As it is with adopting an older child, the first year was challenging. But we also had many times of joy. After our son had been with us for



a few years, Marlin and I began to talk about the possibility of adopting another child. Since our children like to surprise us, it was just a few days after that conversation when our adoption agency called to ask if we would consider adopting a baby girl with Down syndrome who was going to be born in a few months. We were thrilled to say, "Yes!" It was less than two weeks after that call when she arrived early, and we found ourselves nervously driving to the hospital to meet her. Our daughter's beginning was a bumpy one which consisted of an extended neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) stay, several surgeries, some complications, and a feeding tube. It was a joyous day when we finally were able to bring our baby girl home and settle in as a family of four.

Welcoming our daughter into our family also opened our eyes to just how big the need is for families to adopt a child with Down syndrome. We joined the NDSAN (National Down Syndrome Adoption Network) registry of adoptive families

when our daughter was two. Just six months later we were matched with our second son! He was born several states away, and after a brief stay in the NICU, he was discharged. We spent the next week enjoying our vacation home-away-fromhome and soaking in time with our new baby as we waited for the paperwork to be completed to allow us to return home.

After our son was a few years old, we moved to our new home and decided not to renew our adoption home study. We thought our family was complete. But then a still, small voice told us there was one more child who was meant to join our family. We prayed about adopting internationally, and although there are so very many children with Down syndrome who are in need of a family, that is not where the Lord was calling us. Seeking His guidance, we prayed that if we were supposed to adopt again that God would bring the child to us. And that's just what He did. One Sunday afternoon, our adoption agency called us once more to tell us

there was a family who wanted to meet us. A few days later, our families spent the evening together and in a whirlwind of events, we became the proud parents of a new baby boy.

Our family is now complete, and we are so thankful for each of our children and for their birth families who lovingly placed each of them into our arms. Marlin and I feel the Lord's calling on our hearts is to do the best we can to raise the children we have been blessed with, while also raising awareness of the orphans around the world and children in our own community who need someone to care for them.

It can be so easy to list the reasons why it is not a convenient time to foster, adopt, sponsor a child, volunteer on a mission trip, donate to an orphanage, become a mentor, or serve a family who is currently fostering or has recently adopted a child. I would challenge you to take time to think and pray; to be still and to listen to where God may call you to step up and serve. Not everyone is called to adopt, and we cannot all do everything. But we can all do something to help a child in need or help someone who comes from a hard place.

MARLIN: In the fall of 2010, I had been working for a local business for five years and loved my work. Lisa was teaching first graders in our local school district,

but the day our little daughter came into the world, she quit teaching in order to stay home to care for our family. Two months in a neonatal intensive care unit with your baby brings a deeper awareness of the coming costs, specialists, therapies, and needed time for additional appointments. Lisa and I weren't sure how we would pay for all of this.

In light of our new reality, I prayed: "Lord, You brought us these kids, please help me provide for our family."


God was faithful, and he provided for our family through the creation of *Plain Values* magazine. The magazine has been a blessing for us, but I wanted to bless other families, too. In our magazine, we highlighted stories of families and children who were in need, with the hope that our readers would support them. And yet I still felt there was more we could be doing for those with needs deeper than our own.

And this is what God laid on my heart: "Marlin, give the magazine away."

Why would God want me to do something like that? In the business world, you don't just give away a thriving business! I struggled with the idea of freely giving it away, and I wrestled with what God had laid on my heart.

Through time in prayer, I began to understand that God had bigger plans for the magazine than





to only be a business that turned a profit. Giving away *Plain Values* magazine would, in turn, give hope and life to children around the world. When I realized this, I found peace.

Our mission is to help children in need by supporting organizations doing Biblically-sound work. We believe that by sharing our resources with children in need, this will give them room to bloom.


Plain Values will still be a magazine produced with ad revenue; but by giving it to Room to Bloom, this will allow us to use it as a fundraising tool by getting our message out to readers. We believe this is a path where we can make an eternal difference for children in need.

Room to Bloom is an IRS-approved 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization and your donations are tax-deductible. To ensure that we stay focused on our mission, we will have a board that will oversee the organization.

Where does the name "Room to Bloom" come from?


From here, I'll turn it back over to my wife Lisa, who will share with you the story behind the name.

LISA - One of my great joys is gardening. I enjoy growing vegetables and fruit for our family as well as tending large flower beds of perennial plants. Early one spring I was working at one end of the flower garden where we have a border of rocks. Something caught my eye, and I quickly moved in to take a closer look. There, barely peeking from

under the edge of a large stone was a small tulip. It was still wrapped tightly and obviously struggling. The previous fall we had done some reworking of that area and a heavy rock had been placed over this tulip bulb.

I moved the rock away from the tulip. As the spring weather warmed, I watched as it struggled to grow. Its stem was a pale white which lay crooked along the ground instead of standing tall and green like the others. I cleared away the dead leaves, added compost, and trimmed back the overhanging shrub to allow the fragile bulb to soak in the sun's warmth.

Over the next few weeks, I watched the tulip plant change from a sickly white to a lush green. The stem lifted from the earth and the tightly wrapped petals opened up to a beautiful flower. That year, this tulip never did look the same as the other tulips. Its stem was still crooked, and it didn't stand as tall, but that little plant put all its energy into the best flower it could muster, given its tough start. The potential to flourish had been there all along, it just needed the room to bloom. //

While very difficult to think about, in many countries around the world, babies born with medical needs are frequently abandoned. In China alone, over 100,000 children each year are left on their own. They become orphans because of medical conditions such as premature births, heart defects, or cleft lips. While each child is precious in God's perfect eyes, in many societies, those with special needs are sadly found unworthy and discarded.

Such was the case for tiny Ryder, who entered the world last Christmas on a cold, snowy night in east Asia. Rather than being welcomed with prayers of thanksgiving, he was left outside in the cold. When discovered by a passerby, he was in critical condition. Thankfully a call was made to Love Without Boundaries, an international charity that provides healing, education, and refuge to vulnerable children around the globe. Their team members rushed the little baby, who was blue from the cold, to a nearby children's hospital. Ryder



weighed just 4.4 pounds and was quickly diagnosed with severe pneumonia and a heart defect.


Once in the intensive care unit, Ryder was placed on a ventilator, which mechanically pumped oxygen into his fragile body. For two weeks, doctors said they didn't know if he would survive. Countless prayers were lifted for him to find the strength to hold on, and in late January, he was finally able to breathe on his own.

Ryder remained in the hospital until late May, as he battled infections and struggled to gain weight. Tears of joy were shed when he was finally strong enough to be discharged. Ryder was then taken to one of Love Without Boundaries' healing homes, set up for orphaned children needing extra care and interventions. What these special homes provide most of all is the one necessity every orphaned child deserves: the gift of knowing they are loved.

The first five months of Ryder's life were difficult ones, from being left in the cold to only seeing the world from inside an incubator. But now, because of the kindness of those who support

Love Without Boundaries' programs for vulnerable children, Ryder is truly thriving. His first smiles and giggles were recently celebrated, and he is starting to babble. Ryder's transformation from a frail infant to a now-healthy baby boy calls forth scripture from Isaiah 58: "Then your light will break forth like the dawn, and your healing will appear." Ryder's healing has indeed appeared. Ryder's life truly matters.

There are three little words those at Love Without Boundaries believe fully: "Every Child Counts." Every child born is a gift from Almighty God, and every child whose life is saved is a blessing beyond measure. As long as there are children like little Ryder who have no one else to believe in them, Love Without Boundaries will continue their work to bring hope and comfort to those who are often forgotten. //

In Eldoret, Kenya, there lives a foster family. There is a father, a mother, and forty-four children. Each one of these children was abandoned and left for dead in streets, fields, latrines, or garbage dumps. These kids and their parents, Horace and Phyllis Leister, make up the Tumaini Children's Home. A home rightly named because Tumaini means hope.

One bright smile that calls the Tumaini Children's Home her family is named Zuriel. As a newborn, she was abandoned in a grocery bag in a field. She was not rescued from that bag for a week. Despite the desperate state she was found in, she flourished in the care of Horace and Phyllis Leister. Today Zuriel is completely healthy and has one of the most caring hearts and kindest smiles you can find.

These children know their abandonment stories, and along with their parents, they will tell you that it is only by the Lord's hand they survived at all. Many abandoned babies do not survive or cannot recover from their injuries and malnourishment. By the grace of God, and only through His healing hand, has every child placed with the Leisters survived. These children know God has spared their lives, and they are grateful to grow up in a home filled with God's love. They are typical children who love to draw, make bracelets, and hate math class. They have fears and hopes, just like every other child. Dad or mom's lap is the place to be, and if both laps are full, a pillow and blanket by the fireplace are second best as the children await their evening devotions and worship time.

The Leister family is not your typical "foster family" or "children's home." It is a family—a large family built on the love and the Tumaini (hope) of Christ. //

orphans die.

I have been asked everyday about my trip. Well-intended, "How was your trip?" questions. And honestly, I find I lie. I lie and say, "it was hard, but we did a lot of good." And the lie tastes bitter on my tongue. It was more than hard, and there was not a lot of good.

When I disembarked from the plane in Bulgaria, I stepped into this ocean of a problem and got knocked on my back by a tidal wave of crisis and emotions. And I'm sitting here choking on the water, trying to figure out where that wave came from. I was prepared for this trip; I was ready. I had packed, unpacked, and repacked several times. I had gathered supplies, letters, and created PowerPoint teaching slides and videos. But the truth is I never will be prepared, nor do I want to be

prepared to see, hear, and touch what I saw in the orphanages because I should never be ready to look at an innocent child who is starving and flinches at my touch. I never want to sit holding the skin and bones of a seven-year-old-child-who-looks-like-aninfant and feel prepared. So, I have been crushed by the wave, and I'm trying to process it all.

I think back to a training I attended on disaster preparedness. A portion of the training was how to triage and tag victims of a mass casualty incident. Triage tagging is a way to effectively and efficiently distribute limited resources and immediate care until more help arrives. Each victim is assigned a color before the first responder moves to the next victim.

As we moved across Eastern Europe through several orphanages and facilities, I found myself "tagging" the victims and thinking how very little I was doing and how very many victims there were.



Immediate (red tag) - life-threatening

There were many children I saw, and I prayed for death. At the end of each day, I wondered—who was this person I had become? I have never prayed for a child to die, yet I found my soul weeping and begging for God's reprieve. And the part I struggle with is that the reprieve would have been mine. I would have been able to unload the burden of a fourteen-year-old twisted like a pretzel with a hole cut in his mattress to hold his contorted frame. I would have been able to forget about the pressure wounds glistening with bone and ligaments and how they contrasted with his soft, brown eyes framed by thick, black eyelashes. If death had offered a reprieve, I would never have seen the fiveyear-old infant who lay contracted like a strung bow with nostrils flaring and air gasps. I would not have noticed her ragged breaths were the only sound in the room, nor the fact that the rest of the infant-sized children lay "sleeping" in a drug-fogged haze as drool slipped down their cheeks and pooled on their stained sheets. Had death visited, I would never have to carry home an image of a shrunken, yellowing body of a five-year-old. Eyes too large for his tiny frame, lips frothing as he labored to exist. I would not be sitting here now weeping as I type, weeping over the children I left dying in an orphanage. I could have rested in their reprieve from this life, instead of wondering if they were still in pain. Yes, I begged for their death because the weight of it all buckled me to my knees.

Delayed (yellow tag) – serious, non-life-threatening

There were so many children who were physically healthier. I looked at them and searched for hope. They were the quiet witnesses; seeming like shadows. A shadow who was four-year-old;

a boy dressed in a purple sleeper taking a nap at 10 a.m. and still napping five hours later. And this same boy has not met the outside world, but lives suspended in time. He marks the days with the passing of metal cups and mealtimes and has never seen the beautiful garden right outside his window. He cannot smell the roses blooming on the vines, or feel the sun on his face. He has never learned about numbers and letters. His mind sits stagnant with the lack of stimulus.


She is the seven-year-old who does not know what it feels like to have a mother's kiss or a daddy's tickles. She sits rocking day after day on the sagging crib mattress, waiting to fill an empty space inside her heart. Her knuckles are raw and scabbed from where she bites them out of numb boredom. She regurgitates her food to have the sensation of swallowing. Her teeth are corroded, her hair is patchy, and her skin is sallow. She is a job to a caregiver and a burden to a system. Yet she has feelings and hurts; love and fear. Inside her is

contained potential locked away by a disease called "Indifference."

I looked at these children and saw my own son, Israel. I realized he, too, had sat suspended in time, waiting for a future. His only hope was adoption. Their only hope is adoption. If they are not adopted, most will die within institutions. Every child has a basic human right to be loved by a family, regardless of country. Children are not supposed to be raised and die in institutions.

Minor (green tag) - walking wounded

When I first went to the orphanages, I wanted to place blame on families who gave their children up for adoption. I wanted to point a finger at a mother who would just leave her baby at the hospital and walk away. As I opened my eyes and my ears, I learned about the extreme pressure placed on parents who give birth to a special-needs child. Stories of families who were told that their child would die soon or die if they took them home.

Moms who were told that they could not raise their child, and that it would be a burden to their family. And I began to see how the orphanages filled with children.

We met some amazing families who chose to take their child home. These families are the ones who said, "no, I will raise my child at home" when physicians told them it was impossible. They stood up to the pressure and criticism of family and friends when they brought home a less-thanperfect infant. They have weathered years without services, therapies, equipment, and social support. They have been creative in raising their children, from constructing their own medical equipment to driving great distances for help. Many were lonely and struggling while navigating the life of a specialneeds child with no support. When I shared my son Israel's video, they wept. And when I looked at the tears in their eyes, I saw a bridge known only to parents with special needs children, and I couldn't have been prouder of their brave love.

Orphans die. Mostly we never know. They are buried without tears or fanfare. They do not leave

out the front, but are bundled up and carried out the back.

Before I left for Bulgaria, I watched as God moved mountains to help one orphan named Valentina. She was in liver failure, and her conditions were dire. I tentatively began to reach out for support. It soon became obvious I might be able to help her while I was on my trip. I began to make more phone calls and the responses were amazing. One of the best pediatric liver transplant teams coordinated her ongoing care with me, and I watched in awe as people across the world donated everything necessary for her survival.

The weeks before I left, I received her specialty formula, feeding pump and tubing, money for ongoing nurse care, and prayer. The only thing we were missing was the most important part: the adoptive family. We needed a family to adopt her, and they needed to be at a specific point in the adoption process because it needed to happen quickly. And so, we prayed. The world prayed. And one morning, I woke up to a message from a friend. God had answered our prayers, and I was soon put in contact with her new family. In a flurry

of excitement, I was able to secure final letters, dietitian instructions, physician orders, and every piece of equipment was ready in record time. I was going to be able to help save her!

The day before I reached her orphanage, we received a phone call from the orphanage director. Valentina had died...the girl whose eyes captured my heart had died that very night, and I sat in my room and sobbed great big ugly tears. I felt as if I had completely failed, and I couldn't help but think she died alone. Little Valentina "was motionless for an instant; she did not cry out. She fell as gently as a young tree falls." These words from *The Little Prince* were on my heart as I thought of her tragic death. I felt so defeated and tired and numb. I questioned why I had come, why I had chosen to see all these hard things, and what a fool I was to think I could make a difference.

I was sitting in the ashes of my pride and planning, and then a truly beautiful thing began to happen. I began to see how I cannot walk among these children on my own strength and ability. And so, I prayed that God would give me the strength to get up out of that dark place and do what I was meant to do. I walked up the steps of Valentina's orphanage that day, and I loved on the living. I touched the hurting, the marginalized, the silent, and broken. I called them by name and promised them I would tell the world about them. I told them that I would be their voice. And now that I'm home, I realize the triage tagging system only works when help follows. Triage is only labeling. It's when reinforcements come in that change happens and healing begins.

And now you know, too. You cannot say that you never knew there were places where infant-sized children were hidden away to die. You cannot say that you didn't know six-year-olds could be transferred to adult asylums. Now you know orphans die, and you also know I will never remain silent because we are the only voice they have. //







Running Away

At first thought it might seem ridiculous that a grown woman would want to run away. But you might be surprised at the answers you'd get about this from widows (and widowers too).

Sometimes we think that a different place will make life better. One widow told me the story of how, two weeks after her husband's funeral, she fled. She intended to help a sick family member in another state. She discovered that it was too soon. Away from her home, she found herself crying all the time and not able to be around others or to be of any help. After a week she "ran away" again. Instead of going home, she went to see her sons in yet another state. That didn't calm her either, so she bounced back to the first place she fled to. Then she panicked. She wasn't comfortable anywhere! She finally went back to her own home.

Leaving home was not good in this early stage. If you've been there, you don't blame her. She didn't know that the only way to deal with grief is to face it and work through it. You can't run away.

Sometimes we think trying to ignore our hurts and problems will make them go away. Another widow told me that her way of escape was to stay busy. She made sure she had activities to attend five days out of seven. Staying busy gave her a false sense of success. Later, she admitted that she only managed to postpone the process of healing. Into the third year of her widowhood, she dropped most of her activities and faced her sorrows. Then she could begin to forge a future life for herself.

Sometimes we think we can leave the grief behind by getting into a new relationship, a new house, or a new job as soon as possible. I can't tell you the heartache (and divorces) that widows and widowers have faced by getting married



too quickly. Granted, sometimes it does seem to work out, but that's the exception rather than the rule. The general rule to take at least a year before making any changes is a good standard. But not all changes are bad. Small changes, when you're ready, are good practice for the bigger ones. Remodeling your house, building a new home, or starting a new job can be good things, even in the first year. Just don't let them distract you from your real life. Find your own unique pace for change; this is not a race.

Instead of running away, try getting away for a short break. One widow spoke of a visit to the mountains and how she felt lighter, more joyful, and more peaceful there. Getting away helped her put things in perspective. She began to feel as if she could find a new beginning, and maybe someday she'd even move to the mountains. Not everyone will feel such a hopeful change from a short trip, but to her it was the Lord's way of affirmation and peace.

There's something good about planning and looking forward to getting away, rather than impetuously running away. When you're ready, begin to start with some short adventures. It doesn't matter how adventurous the adventure is! A trip to McDonald's counts just as well as a bus tour to Niagara Falls.

Perspective changes over time. After the car accident which took her husband's life, a widow continued with renovation plans on a house that she and her late husband had chosen for retirement. It was in a different state so as she travelled between her two houses she first wanted to believe she could "run away" to the remodeled house and leave all her grief at the old one. But, she admitted, it followed her.

Eventually, though, the remodeled home became her place for starting over instead of running away. To her, starting over seemed more like healing; staying at her former house seemed like going backwards. For another widow, getting away has helped her to realize that she doesn't want to stay away from her home too long. She has several places she likes to visit, but they also make her long for her husband and old times too much. When she's home, although she's without him, she still retains a sense of belonging and love. Each of us responds to getting away differently, and that's a perfectly good thing.

A note about coming home. Arriving home to an empty house can be its own sort of heartbreak at first. Sometimes it's bittersweet, sometimes it's wrenching. After a few tries however, many widows find that their house becomes a safe haven. The opposite can happen as well.


I read about a widower who stayed in his home after his wife died. He thought he'd always stay. But early one evening when he returned home to a darkened house, all he could think of was the scene he used to come home to: the house all lit up, and his wife visible from the kitchen window waiting for him to come home. He discovered that he could stand the stillness of an empty house, but he could not stand the darkness of her absence in the window. And so, he put the house up for sale the next day. The process of going to work and coming home every day helped him make that decision.

Running away is often a temptation, but it's not a solution. Getting away, sort of like a baby bird trying its wings, can be good for many widows IF they will try again and again. There's no reason to be embarrassed if it doesn't work out at first, this is not a test. Each visit out is a practice run; we learn new things each time, and that's very healthy. There's no such thing as failure on the widows' path, there's just always more to learn. Where will your path lead in the next few months? //

ARADICAL KIND OF LOVE



Women who chose to be rebaptized during the Reformation, were making a conscious decision to follow a path that veered sharply away from the reforms of Luther and Zwingli. The bold contrast is evident when comparing the life of Helena von Freyberg, an Anabaptist woman, to the life of Katharina Zell, a Lutheran woman. Both women lived during the time of the Reformation in the early 1500s. They both spoke, wrote, proselytized, aided the reforms—and sheltered reformers—but for different sides and with profoundly different consequences. Helena chose to side with Anabaptism, a faith which was marginalized in that era by the Lutherans, Zwinglians (Reformed), and Catholics. She made the conscious choice to become a part of a radical faith not dependent on systems or forces of the world. We will contrast Helena von Freyberg's life with that of Katharina Zell, who chose the Lutheran faith and thereby was able to remain within a state dependent system.

Katharina Zell was born in Strasbourg and lived her entire life in the city of her birth. A devout and faithful member of the Roman Catholic Church in her youth, she heard the teachings of Martin Luther from a local priest, Matthew Zell, in 1521. She embraced the

new reforms of Lutheran teachings, then married Matthew Zell on December 3rd, 1523. Katharina would clearly have understood that her marriage to a Catholic priest turned Lutheran pastor was an alignment with the Protestant reforms.

As Zell's wife, Katharina sheltered and fed not only fellow Protestants on the run, but also large numbers of refugees from the German Peasants' War. With at least a vernacular education, she wrote tracts, letters, and songs. When her husband died in 1548, she wrote an extended *Lament and Exhortation*, in much the same manner as sermons that were circulated at the time.

Five years after the death of her husband, an incident occurred where she remonstrated Ludwig Rabul, a former boarder at her house, on a theological matter on which they disagreed. He accused Katharina of being "a disturber of the peace of the church." She replied to Ludwig Rabul's accusation with a public letter of defense to the whole citizenship of Strasbourg wherein she said, "I have never mounted the pulpit, but I have done more than any minister in visiting those in misery." She described her role and identity as "a church mother, nurturer of pulpit and school" and that from her "younger days I was so dear to the fine old learned men and architects of the Church of Christ.... They never withheld from me their conversation about holy matters and they gladly from the heart heard mine." Although she had contact with Anabaptism, Katharina never chose rebaptism, instead working for Lutheran reforms.

Whereas Katharina Zell worked for Luther's reforms, Helena von Freyberg was a woman of nobility

who worked for Anabaptist reforms in the Tyrol region of Austria. Helena was an only child whose early connections with reformers were mixed with old family connections from the "von Freyberg" family and the "Marpeck" family. As an example of the two families' interconnectedness, Helena's father Gilg, a noble man from Münichau, sold Heinrich Marpeck "mining and grazing rights." As reforms broke out, Helena and Heinrich Marpeck's Anabaptist son Pilgram would find their paths cross in unusual ways. In addition, the castle in their hometown of Münichau would play an important role for Anabaptists in the region.

When she was around twenty, Helena married a young baron of equal nobility named Onophrius. Together they had four sons who became knights. Legend says that Martin Luther visited Onophrius at his castle in his hometown of Hohenaschau in 1518; if this is in fact true, Helena had knowledge of—and possible interaction with—early reformers.

As the Anabaptist movement spread out of Zürich, Switzerland, and into Germany, the Tyrol region of Austria, and Moravia, the teachings evolved with the different leaders in the various regions. In and around the city of Augsburg, Germany, it was Pilgram, the son of Heinrich Marpeck, old family friend to Helena's family, who emerged as a later influential Anabaptist leader in the southern Germanic regions.

Helena first appears in court records associated with Anabaptism in 1528. In 1523, Helena inherited the Münichau Castle when her stepmother needed funds to free herself from debt after the death of Helena's father. Eventually, Helena occupied the castle and made it a center for Anabaptist activity. When her name first appears in the records, it states that she and her whole household had been rebaptized. Reports also included services held by prominent ministers, including Pilgram Marpeck. From at least 1527-1529, a church flourished there in Helena's Münichau Castle.

It was not until 1529 that reports were verified by an arrested individual and the order went out for her arrest. Helena fled in time to avoid arrest, first to her husband's residence in Tyrol. Discovering she was no longer safe in the Tyrol region, she fled yet again, this time to Constance, a city that today is near the border of Switzerland, Germany, and Austria. Once she settled in Constance, she set about proselytizing and working

to further the cause of Anabaptism until driven out of that region in 1532.

For a brief period she returned to Tyrol when she won her case to recant in private. Having done so, rather than live in quiet, she once again became an active Anabaptist. Helena then relinquished her castle and other property, and her rights, as citizen of her homeland of Tirol. During these times,, she was supported financially by her husband and sons who remained in the Tyrol region, under the influence of Lutheran and Zwinglian reforms.

Finally forced from Tyrol for the last time, Helena lived the final eleven years of her life in Augsburg, Germany. These years proved more productive than her early years in advancing the cause of Anabaptism. During this period she instructed her tailor Hans Jacob Schneider in the Anabaptist faith. In the 1550s and 1560s, he would go on to become a major Anabaptist leader in the Augsburg area working with Pilgram Marpeck.

It was also during this time she was involved with the *Damenkrieg*, or the "war of the ladies." The *Damenkrieg* was an effort between Anabaptist leaders Pilgram Marpeck and Casper Schwenckfeld to gain support of noblewomen such as Helena. Her old family ties to Marpeck, plus the fact that Schwenckfeld was living with Helena's brother-in-law, provided her with a unique place of influence. It was Helena and Magdalena von Pappenheim who passed letters and writings between Marpeck and Schwenckfeld. Through all of it, Helena remained committed to Marpeck's theology.

Marpeck insisted that God's kingdom is one of love: "Here there is no coercion, but rather a voluntary spirit...." Helena chose to follow this path of radical love and stake her own life on the One who said of His life, "No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself."

Helena might have chosen to remain with her husband and family, as did Katharina Zell, and work for Lutheran and Zwinglian reforms. Instead, she chose a way that followed the teachings of Jesus as written in the New Testament. Her life and her writings reveal that the Anabaptism that she committed her life to is rooted in the authentic Christianity of the early church. Followers of this kind of authentic Christianity prioritize loving God and others—even at the cost of their own lives. While Helena suffered the loss of her homeland, her children, and grandchildren for the sake of her faith,

she gained a spiritual family and heritage that reached far beyond her life. Her faith resided in a God who says, "For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for my sake will find it." //

ON FIRE FOR GOD

One day, Rob set a gasoline can about ten feet from the burn barrel. $\,$

"That can is awfully close to the barrel, don't you think?" I said.

"Stop freaking out. I know what I'm doing."

"But I'm pretty sure that's not safe."

"And I'm pretty sure you need to stop freaking out."

The next morning, Rob was outside burning trash in the barrel, but as he dumped cardboard boxes in the can, they just wouldn't catch fire. There were smoldering coals in the bottom of the barrel (sound familiar?), but evidently they weren't hot enough to ignite the cardboard.

That's when Rob's eyes landed on the gasoline can I had warned him about. The can contained only a little bit of gasoline, so he figured it couldn't hurt to pour it on the smoldering coals and give the fire a little encouragement.

He gave the fire a lot more than a little encouragement.

Rob was pouring out the last little bit of gasoline when he saw a flame jump from the bottom of the burn barrel to the can, which was CANINE CORNER

still in his right hand. It all happened in a flash, before he had a chance to react.

Rob told me later that the only thing he remembered thinking was, *Boy, that was stupid.*

The next thing he knew, he was completely on fire.

I was still in bed when I heard the KABLOOM, and I knew immediately what had happened. Dashing outside, I found Rob completely engulfed in flames. I mean completely engulfed. The explosion caused the gasoline to splatter his clothing, so his shirt was on fire, and so were his pants. Remembering the old rule, "Stop, drop, and roll," Rob did just that, but the flames would not go out. So he leaped back up and yanked the burning T-shirt over his head and tossed it aside. But this exposed his bare belly to the fire that still shot up from his flaming pants. So the human torch pulled down his pants and tried to kick them off, but he couldn't get them over his work boots.

By the time I reached him, he was sitting on the ground with his pants around his ankles, and he was patting at the flames wildly.

"I'm all right, I'm all right!" he said.

"You don't look all right."

He probably would have been a lot more convincing if he hadn't still been smoldering when he told me he was okay.

Rob finally managed to douse the flames, and as he put it, he wound up with second-degree burns to his body and a third-degree burn to his male ego. The entire right side of his face was red—as if he'd gotten a bad sunburn or stood too close to a nuclear test explosion. He also had second-degree burns on his belly and on his right hand, which had been holding the gas can when it exploded. The can was torn apart, but his hand remained in one piece.

After these two fiery incidents, I have to say that I can relate to the prophets of old. I'm not saying that I'm a prophet in any way, but I did get a sense of what it's like to issue a warning over and over and not be taken seriously. When I warned Rob about the burn barrel in the trailer or the gas can near the barrel, he dismissed me with a roll of his eyes and a wave of his hand.




I wouldn't have been surprised if Isaiah had been similarly dismissed by the Israelites: "Stop freaking out, Izzy!"

The prophets were busy during the period of the divided kingdoms, when Israel split apart from Judah following the death of Solomon. During this time, Elijah, Elisha, Amos, Isaiah, Hosea, and Micah all tried to warn the people of Judah and Israel to stop running after false gods and to turn back to Yahweh, but inevitably the chosen people would say, "Stop being such a worry wart!"

Josiah, a king in Judah from 640 to 609 BC, tried to eliminate all the temples dedicated to the god Molech, but this god and others kept popping up throughout the land, like the smoldering coals in our burn barrel. (Ironically, Molech was the god of fire.)

Today, we no longer worship a god of fire like Molech or a god of fertility like Baal, but we still have our own twenty-first-century gods. They go by other names: pornography, greed, success at any cost, apathy, and much, much more. So we need to listen for the warnings





in our lives—warnings from friends who care enough about us to point to the smoldering coals in our lives that might burst into flame if we're not careful. These people are the "prophets" in our lives.

Prophets are like smoke detectors, which can sense invisible particulates well before you even see smoke or fire. So make sure you have people in your life who aren't afraid to tell you when you're dragging along a barrel full of hot coals that could burst into flame at any moment.

And while you're at it, clean up the spiritual trash in your life because God sponsors a dump day every single day of the year. //

THE CANINE CORNER

MAMARY GLANDS

This article will cover the topic of mammary glands and some of the disorders that we may see concerning them. Most of the problems will be associated with lactation, but occasionally we will see tumors or other swellings arise that could be confused with mastitis. I have received multiple emergency calls concerning swollen mammary glands and severe mastitis lately, so a review of problems seemed like a good idea.

The most common problem that I see associated with mammary glands is mastitis. Mastitis is infection or inflammation of mammary glands. Mastitis normally occurs after a female has puppies, but can occasionally occur before whelping or with a false pregnancy. Signs of mastitis can include red and firm glands that are warm to the touch and may be painful. In severe cases, the glands may become abscessed and rupture. These abscesses can sometimes be seen when areas of the skin over the affected mammary gland becomes clear or dark or black and bulging. It may start out looking like large blisters on the gland. The female may have a fever, especially when there are abscesses forming. She may also neglect her puppies and become lethargic and not want to eat. The milk from affected glands is often

clear or discolored. Treatment includes antibiotics, hot compresses applied to affected glands, and if abscesses are present, opening and draining the abscesses and trimming the dead tissue. The ruptured glands are then allowed to heal as an open wound. Pups can usually still be allowed to nurse the female if there are glands which are not affected. I tend to see problems with diarrhea and puppies not feeling well if a female's temperature is above 103 degrees and the puppies are still being allowed to nurse. Puppies should be supplemented until the female's temperature drops below 103 degrees and the milk appears more normal. Puppies should also receive treatment if they have developed signs of diarrhea.

One of the common signs seen with false pregnancy is something called galactorrhea, which is the medical term for inappropriate milk production. Whether a dog is pregnant or not, after a heat cycle, all dogs go through a two-month period of high progesterone, which rapidly falls and stimulates a hormone called prolactin. This rise in prolactin can stimulate milk production, even in females which are not pregnant. Some females can be difficult to tell if they are having a false pregnancy or if they are only pregnant with one or two puppies. In these cases, a radiograph is needed to make an accurate determination of pregnancy or false pregnancy. Unless mastitis occurs during a false pregnancy, the milk which is produced should quickly dry up in a week or two. Do not attempt to milk out a female that is producing milk because of a false pregnancy, as this will signal her body to keep producing milk.

Another problem that can be seen commonly in the mammary glands of dogs is tumors. Tumors or neoplasia are seen as hard masses or lumps in the mammary chain. They are usually not painful and can be seen at any time during the cycle, not just after whelping. Some of

these masses are benign (not spreading) and some of the masses are malignant (spreading to nearby tissues, lymph nodes, and lungs). You will not be able to tell if a mass is benign or malignant unless the mass is either aspirated and examined microscopically or removed surgically and then examined under the microscope. Treatment is surgical removal, but the prognosis depends on if the mass is benign or malignant.

Finally, sometimes inguinal hernias can be confused as a problem with the mammary glands. The last two mammary glands sometimes appear enlarged when it is actually an inguinal hernia. Most of the time this will be a soft swelling, but if something from the abdominal cavity becomes trapped in an inguinal hernia, it will be hard. I have seen fat, intestines, the urinary bladder, the uterus, and even an unborn puppy trapped inside an inguinal hernia. It is more common to see these swellings when the female is in heat, but it could occur at any time. The hernia is actually underneath the mammary tissue, so it does not affect the mammary gland itself, but it can make it appear that the mammary gland is swollen. Surgical repair is the treatment for an inguinal hernia, but it is not recommended that females that have had inguinal hernias repaired be used for breeding due to the concerns of it being an inherited condition.

I hope this review of the mammary glands has been helpful. If you have any concerns about any of your females having any of these conditions or if you are treating a suspected mastitis that is not improving, you should contact your veterinarian to schedule an exam. //


